Children will be advised that it may be dark inside and that there are obstacles inside. This includes advising of possible head injury from low obstacle in the first short tunnel maze. Children who do not like cramped or small spaces will be advised not to participate in the activity. Children also advised that the tunnels have been tested by educator during pre-excursion visit and that it there is ample room for their size. A maximum of 2 children at a time in the small tunnel maze and up to 5 in the big tunnel maze. The big tunnel maze has 4 access points, the entrance, the exit and two emergency hatches which can be unlatched should a child get stuck inside or gets claustrophobic. Low-level Bouldering	Injury from mis-use of equipment		Children will be advised by educators to use Wall 4, which is the beginners wall. Educators will check the safety mat that it is in working order before use of bouldering wall. If any concerns, educators will raise with Edge Staff. Children will be spread along the wall to give ample room to climb with a maximum of 4 children on the wall at one time. Children will be advised to wait on the floor adjacent to the mat for their turn. Children will fall onto mat from the bouldering. Once a child lands on the mat, they will be advised to hop off and join the rest of the children on the floor to allow the next one to have their turn. Rock Climbing	Tripping hazards from anchor points in lower-level floor	Moderate	Children will be advised to walk when accessing the lower level of the rock climbing arena (this area includes the Low- Level Bouldering and the big tunnel maze). Children will be advised to watch where they are walking due to anchor points that are holes in the floor and may contain anchors that can be a trip hazard. Educators to direct children should they be near those hazards. Seating areas and equipment are adjacent to these anchors to minimise walking access to trip over. Up to level 15 can be done easily for a first time climber. Children will be advised they can also choose the rainbow option, ie using all the colours to climb if they choose to. Rock Climbing	Faulty Equipment	High	The auto-belay system is certified yearly and inspected daily by Edge Staff before use. This current brand of auto-belay system has currently no known issues and hasn't been recalled. The harnesses are inspected monthly by the Edge Staff. The manual belay systems are also inspected daily. Should educators become aware of a fault in any equipment, they are to cease the activity safely and to advise the Edge Staff of the fault.
