Many viewing spaces have Perspex fences to allow visibility without climbing. The domestic sheep area and Australian animal area are open for groups during set times. When open, a keeper will be on hand to remind everyone of the rules. Hand sanitiser is provided at the gates and will be used on the way in and out.
