Activity	Injury from entrance, exit, during flight	High	An iFLY coach/trainer will be in the tube at all times a participant is in the tube during a flight. The coach/trainer will enter prior to, and exit after, any participants. This is to ensure each participant can enter and exit safely. Coach/Trainer will stay nearby participant to assist if they should loose balance and/or fall to ground. The ground is made of a flexible mesh to absorp and minimise impact to ground. Coach/Trainer will use symbols to give directions to participants to assist in staying up right and keeping afloat. Children will be directed by educators to leave all loose items (such as rings, tissue packets, etc) to be stowed in the briefing room before flight and to collect after flight. All children will wear enclosed shoes and the iFLY overalls before and during each flight. Children and educators will be given a safety briefing session, including a video, before commencement of changing into overalls and the flight. This includes advising children to sit on the seating area in the tunnel and only move when called for their turn or when exiting the tunnel once all flights have bee completed and the wind has ceased in the tube. 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




