### **Homework Club**

Each afternoon following afternoon tea, our educators provide the children with the opportunity to complete their homework. The children have shown dedication and an amazing commitment to completing their homework during this term. The children have also displayed kindness by assisting one another in these tasks. Check out how proud the children are to receive their homework stickers every time they complete their work at NWOOSH!

If your child is on our homework list on the selected day your child/ren will be asked to get their homework books and readers from their bag. If your child is on the homework list but does not have their homework with them, our educators will ask them to participate in some reading until homework club concludes! Please ensure you have communicated with your child/ren and your enrolment has been updated via the parent portal with the accurate designated homework days.

### **Emergency Procedures & Safety Week**

Emergency procedures are a regulated requirement reflected in the Centre's policies and procedures, that the centre undertakes emergency drills every three months, this is also known as 'Safety Week'. This is to assist the children, educators and families in keeping refreshed with the procedures at NWOOSH. To prepare for the upcoming bushfire season, during safety week this term we were joined by Westleigh Rural Fire Service (1B) for a lesson regarding fire safety. The children discussed the importance of having fire alarms in the home, starting a fire safety plan in the home and the importance of practicing this plan. The children also learnt what to do if you are on fire (Stop, Drop and Roll), what number to call if you are in an emergency and the importance of knowing your home address. The children were also treated to a close up look of the fire truck and listened to the sound of the siren and horn.

Our Educators practiced lock downs and evacuation procedures during both morning and afternoon sessions for an entire week. The Centre's Emergency procedures are available view at the entrances for each room used by the centre as well as in our policies and procedures document available on our website. ### **Acknowledgement of Country**

NWOOSH has recently introduced an Acknowledgement of Country that the children have been participating in daily. Our Skoosh children have been reading this out to all the age groups which has allowed for mixed inter-age grouping introduction and given a chance for the Skoosh children to develop their leadership skills and relationships with the younger children.

We have started the Acknowledgement of Country as this links into our Philosophy in Area 2, where we acknowledge diversity and embed this into our daily practice, and Philosophy Area 6, by getting the children to develop respect for the community both local and global.

Through this, we hope to develop each child's cultural competence, through promoting respect and leading to an increased knowledge about indigenous cultures.

We have tailored our Acknowledgement to include a sign language response, as part of encouraging inclusivity at the centre and as feedback from children, as some use sign language at home. The children have been taught by their peers how to say other words in sign-language, such as thank-you. We aim to ensure the children will become more global citizens with an understanding and respect for a broader culture.

### **Late Collection Fee**

If you are running late to collect your child/ren please call to notify our educators. If you collect your child after 6:15pm, you may be charged a late collection fee of \$1.00 per minute to cover the cost of the staff who need to stay at the centre with your child.

Please Note: NWOOSH must be advised separately to the school!

A Non-Notification Fee of \$15.00 may be charged for failing to notify the Centre by the required time each session.

### Carpark Safety & Parking

A friendly reminder that the OOSH Carpark **cannot** be accessed by parents before **04:30PM.** In addition, marked car spots must not be parked in during these times particularly the two spots marked 'Pre-School'.

Please also limit your speed and drive **SLOWLY** within the OOSH Carpark in order to protect the safety of our children, their parents and the school staff.

Furthermore, after **4:30PM** we ask that you collect your children directly from the NWOOSH front gate where an educator will greet you to sign out. The children must also be accompanied by an adult, parent or guardian at all times whilst walking through the carpark.





### **Privacy, Confidentiality and Handling of Complaints**

Please remember that parents / carers are not permitted to approach other children whilst at the Centre. Any concerns, including behaviour, should be raised directly with the NWOOSH team allowing any issues to be dealt with in line with the appropriate guidelines. To raise concerns or provide feedback, please discuss with Responsible Person on Duty at the centre, or you can raise matter directly with the OOSH Management Committee by emailing the centre (oosh@nwoosh.com.au) with your best contact details."
